Dear Dr. Cibula,

We are pleased to advise you that the Economic and Social Council at its 1979 First Regular Session, Fourth Plenary meeting on 11 April decided to place your organization on the Roster.

Your organization may now designate official representatives to the United Nations, preferably in both New York and Geneva in order to play an active role in the consultative arrangement process. We are enclosing for your careful study another copy of Resolution 1296 (XLIV) and ask you to re-read Parts IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX and X. The procedures and privileges of your relationship to the Economic and Social Council are described therein.

Please find enclosed a documents checklist which you should return to us giving the name and address of the persons to whom you would like to have documents sent. You should know, however, that currently all documentation is sent by surface mail often causing a delay in receipt. This is why it is important to appoint representatives to the Geneva and New York areas not only to attend meetings regularly but also to collect relevant documentation in ample time to be effective.

We invite you to visit our office if you are ever in New York, or that of Mlle. Raymonde Martineau at the Palais des Nations, if in Geneva. We look forward to a fruitful working relationship with your organization and its representatives.
